The Literary Maze was designed to cultivate student interest in English vocabulary, language fluency, and communication skills through a series of interactive and intellectually stimulating rounds.

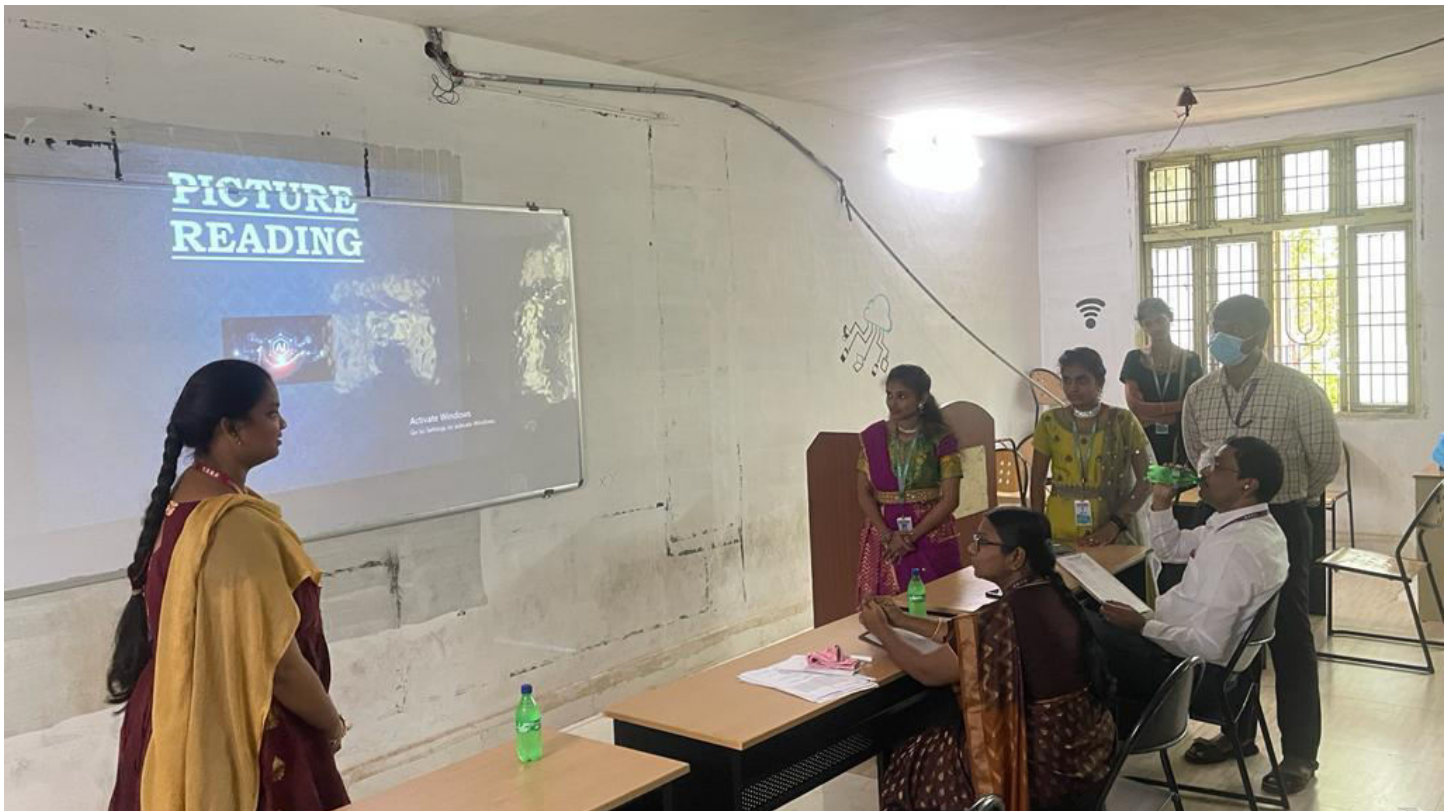
The competition featured the following rounds:
